Board of Directors Meeting January 14, 2016

The Twin Platte Natural Resources District (TPNRD) Board of Directors meeting was held at the Great Western Bank Meeting Room, Second Floor, 111 South Dewey Street, North Platte, Nebraska on January 14, 2016. Mr. Schilz called the meeting to order at 3:06 pm. A legal notice of the meeting was published in the NORTH PLATTE TELEGRAPH. A news release containing the agenda for the meeting and including the time and place was sent to the news media in the District.

Mr. Meismer, Water Resources Subcommittee Chairperson, presented a report for the Subcommittee meeting held on January 14, 2016.

Offset Water – Nebraska Cooperative Republican Platte Enhancement Project (NCORPE) – North Pipeline – NPPD Agreement – Mr. Meismer reported that available for the Directors' was a draft agreement to use a portion of the Nebraska Public Power District (NPPD) Sutherland Project facilities to deliver and/or store the water pumped from the NCORPE Project. Mr. Meismer reported that the draft agreement has been reviewed by the TPNRD legal counsel.

Mr. Meismer moved the Water Resources Subcommittee's recommendation to the Board of Directors to approve the Nebraska Public Power District Agreement to deliver water for the TPNRD and authorize the General Manager to execute the agreement for the TPNRD. Mr. Wiseman seconded the motion. The motion carried. (Motion #5)

Offset Water – Nebraska Cooperative Republican Platte Enhancement Project (NCORPE) – North Pipeline – Financing – Mr. Miller reported on the Nebraska Water Resources Cash from which the TPNRD received \$922,500.00 for the purchase of the NCORPE land and that the TPNRD has been approved to receive \$2,595,106.00 for the construction of the NCORPE north pipeline.

Mr. Miller reported that there currently are no funds available in the State Revolving Fund (SRF) that could be used for building the NCORPE north pipeline and that is not expected to

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change in the next several years. Mr. Miller reported that there are new ammonia regulations for community water systems and the SRF is fully committed to communities for several years. Mr. Miller reported that he met with Jim Macy, NE DEQ Director, on March 23, 2015, December 15, 2015, and January 4, 2016 to determine if funds were available in the SRF. Mr. Miller reported that NE DEQ first approached the TPNRD in 2013 proposing to use funds from the SRF for the north pipeline. Mr. Miller reported that funds were available at that time, the TPNRD completed an application, and DEO approved the TPNRD using those funds for the north pipeline. Mr. Miller reported that after the funds were approved, the legal counsel for DEQ determined that DEQ did not have the statutory authority to use the SRF for the north pipeline. Mr. Miller reported that DEQ then withdrew the funds that they had designated for the north pipeline. Mr. Miller reported that Senator Ken Schilz then agreed to introduce legislation, LB 174, that would provide the statutory authority to allow the TPNRD to use funds from the SRF for the north pipeline. Mr. Miller reported that since the TPNRD desires to build the north pipeline in 2016, and SRF funds will not be available, he had notified Senator Schilz that the TPNRD does not now need the statutory change proposed in LB 174 and that he could suspend seeking approval of LB 174 from the Legislature.

Mr. Meismer reported that the Water Resources Subcommittee would be discussing funding options for construction of the North Pipeline.

Offset Water – Nebraska Cooperative Republican Platte Enhancement Project (NCORPE) – Well Field Operations – Mr. Meismer reported that several Board members, following the November 12, 2015 TPNRD Board meeting, requested information be provided to the Board in regard to the Republican River Compact and agreements with Kansas, issues remaining with Kansas, and how Nebraska's flow requirement are determined. Mr. Meismer reported that Jesse Bradley, NE DNR, will report to the TPNRD Board on March 10, 2016. (*Later rescheduled for February 18, 2016.*)

Offset Water – Nebraska Cooperative Republican Platte Enhancement Project (NCORPE) – Ground Water Levels – Mr. Meismer reported that available for the Directors' was an aerial photo of the NCORPE property showing the locations of ground water monitoring wells, and graphs for the monitoring wells.

<u>Offset Water - N-CORPE Project - Sponsors Meetings</u> - Mr. Weaver reported that the next N-CORPE sponsors meeting will be held February 17, 2016 at 10 am in Curtis, Nebraska.

Offset Water – Irrigation Districts – Instream Flows – Mrs. Dimmitt reported that Platte Valley Irrigation District sustained extensive damage to a portion of their canal along the South Platte River during the high water in the South Platte River in 2015 and they are unable to deliver water to 480 acres. Mrs. Dimmitt reported that the estimate to repair the damage is over \$600,000.00. Mrs. Dimmitt reported that Platte Valley would like to suspend delivery of water to the 480 acres if the TPNRD would allow the 480 acres to be irrigated only with ground water. Mrs. Dimmitt reported that Platte Valley is willing to divert the canal flows previously used for irrigation of the 480 acres into the South Platte River.

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Mr. Meismer reported that the Subcommittee discussed if there would be any benefit to the TPNRD and agreed that there most likely would be no benefits to the TPNRD, and there would most likely be no new depletions that would cause harm to the TPNRD. Mr. Meismer reported that the Subcommittee agreed that the TPNRD would allow the 480 acres to be irrigated with ground water only provided that Platte Valley agreed to divert the canal flows previously used for irrigation of the 480 acres into the South Platte River and that Platte Valley would measure and maintain records of the flows diverted into the South Platte River.

<u>Offset Water – Irrigation Districts – Excess Flows Water Rights</u> – No report presented.

Nebraska Water Resources Association - TPNRD Membership - Mr. Meismer reported that available for the Directors' was a Nebraska Water Resources Association (NWRA) letter, December 21, 2015, inviting membership and a NWRA Membership Form. Mr. Meismer reported that the TPNRD discontinued membership in the NWRA several years ago due to a substantial increase in membership dues for the TPNRD. Mr. Meismer reported that the Subcommittee agreed that they were not interested in the TPNRD becoming a member of NWRA.

TPNRD Ground Water Management Plan – No report presented.

<u>Platte Basin Over-Appropriated Plan</u> – Mr. Meismer reported that discussions have begun between the NRDs in the Platte Basin and NE DNR for reviewing, and revisions as needed, for the Platte Basin Over-Appropriated Plan, required to be completed by August 2019. Mr. Meismer reported that the Subcommittee agreed to select Mr. Wahlgren to be the TPNRD representative and Mr. Meismer to be the TPNRD alternate representative.

<u>TPNRD Integrated Management Plan</u> – Mr. Meismer reported that reviewing, and revisions as needed, for the TPNRD Integrated Management Plan, required to be completed by August 2019, would need to begin in late 2017 or early 2018.

<u>Data</u> - Mr. Miller reported that an application, approved by the TPNRD Board on July 11, 2013, has been submitted to the NE Environmental Trust (NET) by the CPNRD and the TPNRD in 2013, 2014, and 2015 for a project titled "Advanced Hydrogeologic Frameworks

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for Aquifer Management in Critical Sections of the Platte River Basin". Mr. Miller reported that NET, last week, approved the application for full funding of \$760,000.00 (70%) over two years. Mr. Miller reported that the project is a combination of geophysical, geologic, remote sensing, and geographic information system (GIS) technologies applied to construct a hydrogeologic framework of the Platte River basin area within the TPNRD and the CPNRD. Mr. Miller reported that in the TPNRD, the project will include the North Platte River valley, the South Platte River valley, and the Platte River valley, and the NCORPE Project area. Mr. Miller reported that the NCORPE area will include a dense flight block of AEM flight lines centered on the core area of water well production. Mr. Miller reported that the new framework geology will provide aquifer material information on a finer scale then now exist and supports base inputs to water management planning and modeling. Mr. Miller reported that available for the Directors' was a map showing project flight lines.
